

# SEXUAL MISCONDUCT\* REPORTING OPTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

## ON-CAMPUS REPORTING OPTIONS

**Anonymous Reporting:** Any survivor may file an anonymous report. The report form need not include the name of the survivor or the accused, unless the survivor chooses to include them. Filing an anonymous report will ensure that information is recorded in the event the survivor would like to file a complaint at a later date and also assists the University in compiling accurate crime statistics. Survivors are encouraged to include their initials, in the event they would like later to file a formal complaint, although this is not required. **Confidential Reporting:** The Student Victim Advocate and therapists from Counseling and Psychological Services (working in their capacity as therapists) are confidential reporting resources. They can take a confidential report, link a victim to support resources, and explain the various options for filing a formal complaint.

**Formal Reporting:** The University of the Pacific takes incidents of sexual misconduct very seriously and encourages students to report all incidents. Survivors are free to report instances of sexual misconduct to the University regardless of whether or not they choose to press formal charges with law enforcement. Formal reporting may or may not result in University or criminal charges being filed.

*If a survivor discusses the incident with a University staff, or faculty member, with the exception of therapists from Counseling and Psychological Services and the Student Victim Advocate who are confidential resources, the staff or faculty member must forward any report of sexual misconduct to the Title IX Coordinator.
